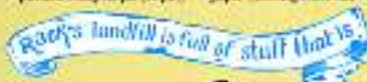

Decomposing in parks, yards, forests, vegetable gardens, compost bins – also creates a tasty snack! The sad thing is that these things shouldn't even be in the landfill, along with most of the other stuff. Organic materials eventually break down even if you see a dog dig, and can be put in a compost pile (or pit).

At least until it decomposes. A battery, stack, or a really compact that can be used to grow new plants.

Among the non-organic things that don't seem to be there are clothes (if they're in good condition you can give them away or they can be recycled), paper (stronger than can

also be recycled but more paper, particularly from food being cut down to make new paper), glass (can be recycled easily), metal (aluminum, rubber (recyclable) and plastic (can be recycled a few times, but not infinitely like wood). For a long time, it's the simplest from to do.
